



Winter Hours Now in Effect

For the months of October 1 through May 31, water users can irrigate with sprinkler systems to water lawns, gardens, and landscaped areas only between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 pm to avoid water loss or damage from freezing.


The Victorville City Library

That's right - the City's Development Department has been busy issuing permits for new construction. Before long, residents will be dining at a new **El Pollo Loco** in the Crossroads Shopping Center, located on the northwest corner of Highway 395 and Palmdale Road. **Sally's Beauty Supply** and **GNC** will also take up residence in the Crossroads Shopping Center. A fun new pub and eatery, **The Tilted Kilt**, will move into the building formerly occupied by the Red Robin, on Mariposa

Road. Just in time for holiday shopping, the Mall of Victor Valley will welcome

Charlotte Russe, a trendy clothing store, as well as a new and improved location for Zales Jewelers. And residents will soon say goodbye to the long standing Ambassador Inn on Palmdale Road as it becomes a **Holiday Inn**, undergoing significant renovations to the interior and exterior.



San Bernardino County Fire Department

It is with great pleasure that the City of Victorville and the San Bernardino County Fire Department announce they have been awarded two Assistance to Firefighter grants totaling nearly \$550,000 by the U.S. Fire Administration, a branch of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The Victorville City Council continues to place a high priority on public safety, and is being rewarded for such. A majority of these grants are awarded for safety equipment such as protective clothing and breathing apparatus. However, in this case, due to the City of Victorville's dedication to public safety, especially during the economic downturn and their commitment to avoid closing fire stations, they are being awarded this rare grant to purchase fire apparatus.

The grants will be used to purchase a Type I Structural Fire Engine as well as seven fire-engine mounted Mobile Data Computers (MDC). The new Type I Fire Engine will be placed into service at Fire Station 311 (located near the fairgrounds) and is expected to be in service by the third quarter of 2015. The new engine can carry 500 gallons of water and is capable of pumping in excess of 1,500 gallons of water per minute. The engine will be equipped with a full array of firefighting equipment, extrication tools and paramedic equipment.

The Mobile Data Computers will be installed in all fire engines and fire trucks as part of an ongoing effort to find ways to reduce response times to incidents by providing

up-to-the-second information and mapping capabilities.

The grant requires a 10% match from the city, ultimately saving the city hundreds of thousands of dollars to replace this piece of apparatus.

"County Fire continues its efforts to find funding sources to replace aging equipment and purchase state of the art equipment that will ultimately benefit the citizens we serve" stated Division Chief Dan Munsey. "This is yet another partnership opportunity to provide premier fire service to the residents of Victorville."

Fire Station 311 is the busiest station in the High Desert, responding to over 7,000 calls for service in 2013. They serve the downtown section of the city, with population estimates in excess of 40,000 people daily. Station 311 is manned with six personnel, two Captain's, two Engineer's, and two Firefighter / Paramedics.

Animal Care & Control

What you need to know about licensing your dog...

Every dog that lives in the City limits must be licensed and vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the City of Victorville Municipal Code. This helps protect the general health, safety and welfare of all persons within the City.

New residents have 60 days to acquire a license for their dog(s), and persons renewing a dog license have a 30-day grace period following the expiration/renewal date.

In addition, no more than three adult dogs or adult cats can be maintained at a single residence.



Licensing is easy! You can download an application from the City's website, then bring it in with proof of rabies vaccination and certificate of sterility, if applicable, to the Victorville City Hall, Cashier's Window, 14343 Civic Drive, M-Th 7:30 - 5:30 or the ACC Division Office, 14206 Amargosa Rd., M-Th 7:00 - 4:30. You may also mail your application to Victorville Animal Care and Control, PO Box 5001, Victorville, CA 92393.

Protect Your Water Supply!

Use the City's FREE Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center

Did you know that Victorville's water comes from aquifers underneath the ground? It does. The Victorville Water District pumps water out from under the ground, from 36 active wells located within an 85 square mile area. The water in the "Mojave River Basin" is replenished from rainwater and from runoff from local mountains.

So...this means that we need to dispose of waste correctly, or it could contaminate our water supply. Motor oil, paint, or other chemicals poured on the ground could seep down into our water. Protect your water and protect your kids and pets from unwanted, unused hazardous materials. Get these materials out of your house and dispose of them properly. Here's how:

The City of Victorville's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center offers FREE disposal of motor oil, household chemicals, paints, fluorescent lights, household batteries. It is located on Love's Lane, off of Desert Knolls Drive, behind the County Fairgrounds. It is open Wednesdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Residents only—no businesses. 
