

Victorville Water District

Mandatory Stage 2 Water Restrictions Are Now in Effect

Your help is needed to achieve 28% water conservation mandate.

California continues to experience one of the most severe droughts on record. In May, the CA State Water Resources Board adopted regulations mandating water suppliers to cut potable (drinkable) water usage. The Victorville Water District has been mandated to achieve a 28% conservation level compared to 2013 levels. In response to the State mandate, the Victorville Water District adopted Ordinance VWD-012 and Resolution VWD 15-006 as of May 19, 2015.

What Does This Mean for Victorville Water District Customers?

Water waste is prohibited. Water waste is defined as "unreasonable or non-beneficial use of water-use of water for any purpose which allows flooding or run off..."

It is prohibited to water of turf, ground cover, open ground, shrubs, etc. in a manner or to an extent which allows Excess Runoff. Excess Runoff is defined to be runoff which causes flooding, impedes traffic, creates a hazardous condition, or causes damage to public or private rights of way.

Use of potable (drinkable) water in fountains or other water features is prohibited, unless the fountain has a re-circulating system.

Washing down solid surfaces such as driveways, sidewalks, or patios is prohibited, unless necessary for health or safety.

Restaurants are prohibited from serving water to customers, unless is it specifically requested.

It is prohibited to apply water to outdoor landscapes during or within 48 hours of measurable rain.

It is prohibited to irrigate ornamental turf on public street medians.

Motor vehicle washing is prohibited, except at commercial washes with recirculating system.

Pools/spas must be covered when not in use.

Fall overseeding of turf areas, unless irrigated with reclaimed water for non-residential water intensive landscape is prohibited.

Properties without addresses and other large outdoor landscapes such as parks, schools, cemeteries, golf courses, etc. are prohibited from Wed/Sat watering. Those with Large Systems of more than 10 watering stations can submit alternative "Reduction Plan" showing how conservation will be achieved.

Watering by hand those brown or dry spots at other times is allowed, if a hand-held hose is equipped with a shut off nozzle.

This easy-to-use interactive online guide is available for customers to view over 300 plants and 800 spectacular photos that showcase desert friendly plants suitable for our climate. Use this guide as a valuable tool to get started on that landscaping project! Search for trees, shrubs, and perennials, flower color and more! Locate the canopy coverage number by referring to each plants description. This information is important if you are participating in the Cash for Grass lawn replacement program.

COLD WEATHER IS RIGHT AROUND THE CORNER

- If you are going away during the cold weather, leave the heat on in your home to no lower than 55 degrees and open kitchen and bathroom cabinets so warm air from the room circulates around pipes.
- Designate a person to check your house regularly; show them where the main water shutoff valve is located.
- Prevent irrigation water from flowing off the landscape onto sidewalks and streets. Freezing temperatures, along with water, can create ice and present a slipping hazard.
- Turn the automated sprinkler timer (controller) to "off" when rain is forecasted.
- During normal business hours, Water Conservation Specialists can answer questions relating to water conservation, or concerns about high water use. Call: 1-866-955-4426.
- Insulate outside faucets, above ground pipes, and hose bibs to protect against leaks caused by freezing. Use rags covered in plastic, fiberglass or preformed foam.
- In case of an emergency, know the location of your water supply shut off valve.
- During holidays and/or after hours if you have an emergency where you have an uncontrolled leak at your home, or observe one within our service area, contact the City of Victorville Water District at: 760-245-6424.



With the possibility of increased rainy periods in the upcoming year, the City of Victorville and the San Bernardino County Fire Department want to remind residents to be safe, and to have their properties prepared for flood conditions and heavy rain fall!

PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR EL NIÑO

STORM DRAINS

If storm drains in the street are obstructed, please notify City of Victorville Public Works.

ROOFS

Inspect your roof, or hire a roofing contractor to check for loose tiles, holes, or other signs of trouble.

RETAINING WALLS

Inspect retaining wall drains, surface drains, culverts, ditches, etc. for obstructions or signs of malfunction, before the season, and after every storm.

SANDBAGS

Consider stockpiling sandbags & plastic sheeting. Sandbags can be stacked to keep water from flooding low areas. Plastic sheeting secured with sand bags can be placed on slopes to prevent water from eroding dirt away. Need sandbags? Turn page over!

YARD CLEAN-UP

Inspect for debris, dead trees or limbs, outdoor furniture or other objects that could be washed away in rains. They can clog storm drains and cause flooding.

DRAINS & GUTTERS

Clear debris & ensure proper functioning. Direct storm water from roofs, driveways and patios into a collection system to avoid soil saturation. For homes without, consider installing.

SLOPES

Inspect sloped areas for signs of gullying, surface cracks, slumping, etc. Inspect patios & walls for signs of cracking or movement. If problems are suspected, have a geotechnical engineer inspect the site.

SAFEGUARD YOUR POSSESSIONS

Create a personal disaster preparedness file containing information about all your possessions and keep it in a secure place, such as a safe deposit box or waterproof container. This file should contain:

- A copy of your insurance policies (Homeowner/Renter) with your agent's contact information. (Do not assume that you have flood insurance.)
- A household inventory: For insurance purposes, it's best to keep a written and visual (i.e., videotaped or photographed) record of all major household items and valuables, even those stored in attics or garages.
- Copies of all other critical documents, including finance records or receipts of major purchases.
- Store important pictures or other irreplaceable items in safe areas or in waterproof containers.

FREE SANDBAGS/SAND

During the El Nino 2015-2016 storm season, sandbags are available to Victor Valley residents* for flood control purposes to provide a barrier from flooding to the front door and slider door areas only. Disposal of sandbags is the resident's responsibility.

AFTER A FLOOD

- Before you re-enter, let qualified specialists inspect & make repairs to structural damage & utility breaks.
- When inspecting your home for the first time, use a flashlight, not a torch or lantern. Sniff for gas leaks.
- Wear rubber-soled shoes and rubber gloves in case of severed electrical lines.
- Don't turn on electrical switches.
- Check electrical circuits only when electricity has been shut off.
- Don't use flooded electrical appliances until they have been repaired.



DEVELOP A FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN

- Create a safety kit with drinking water, canned food, first-aid, blankets, a radio, and a flashlight.
- Post emergency telephone numbers by the phone and teach your children how to dial 9-1-1.
- Plan and practice a flood evacuation route with your family. Know safe routes from home, work, and school that are on higher ground.
- Ask an out-of-state relative or friend to be your emergency family contact.



Join the "Don't Trash Our Desert" Campaign

The City of Victorville is pleased to support the Don't Trash Our Desert campaign. The Don't Trash Our Desert campaign was created in mid-2015 by a coalition of concerned local citizens, businesses, organizations, and public agencies. Its goal is to promote a unified public awareness campaign aimed at keeping our desert clean of litter, illegal dumping and other debris.

The Don't Trash Our Desert slogan and logo has been appearing on numerous Victor Valley electronic and other billboards around, on various websites, and on Victor Valley Transit buses. The City of Victorville has placed the logo on its I-15 electronic sign board for the AutoPark on Valley Center Drive. Presentations have been made to local City/Town councils, service organizations, and to local media outlets. Getting involved is simple. Businesses and residents can help spread the "Don't Trash Our Desert" message and take an active role in helping put a stop to litter in our communities. You can volunteer for local Adopt-A-Street and Community Cleanup programs, use free bulky item pickup services in your community, and spread the message to friends, family, and co-workers.

A big problem is illegal dumping. Please think carefully before hiring someone with a pickup truck to haul away your junk. Is the person really going to haul stuff to the County landfill, or will he just dump it in the desert? If the price offered is "too good to be true," then it's very likely they aren't going to properly dispose of your extra trash. A better choice is to use free bulky item service from your local trash hauler. If you still have more extra trash, then rent a temporary bin from your local trash hauler.

Your Recycling & Trash Questions Answered!

Q. What do I do with old garden hoses?

Answer: Put old garden hoses in your regular trash barrel.

Q. What do I do with aerosol cans?

Answer: If they are empty, you can put them in your blue recycling barrel. If they are full, take them to the City of Victorville's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.

Q. What do I do with plastic bags?

Answer: 1) Reduce—Use reusable bags so you don't bring home so many disposable plastic grocery bags; 2) Reuse and Dispose—use plastic grocery bags as liners for your kitchen and bathroom trash cans, for kitty litter, doggie-doo, diapers, and then toss them in the trash; 3) Take Surplus Plastic Bags Back to Store and Recycle—most stores have plastic bag recycling bins near the front entrance. 4) Not in the Blue Bin—Please do NOT put plastic bags in your blue recycling bin! They jam up our sorting equipment. Please do not put recyclables in plastic bags. Just put recyclables into your blue bin loose—or put them in a paper bag

Animal Care & Control

What you need to know about licensing your dog...

Every dog that lives in the City limits must be licensed and vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the City of Victorville Municipal Code. This helps protect the general health, safety and welfare of all persons within the City.

New residents have 60 days to acquire a license for their dog(s), and persons renewing a dog license have a 30-day grace period following the expiration/renewal date.

In addition, no more than three adult dogs or adult cats can be maintained at a single residence.

Licensing is easy! You can download an application from the City's website, then bring it in with proof of rabies vaccination and certificate of sterility, if applicable, to the Victorville City Hall, Cashier's Window, 14343 Civic Drive, M-Th 7:30 - 5:30 or the ACC Division Office, 14206 Amargosa Rd., M-Th 7:00 - 4:30. You may also mail your application to Victorville Animal Care and Control, PO Box 5001, Victorville, CA 92393.


