
## Mandatory Stage 2 Water Restrictions Are Now in Effect

### Your help is needed to achieve 28% water conservation mandate.

California continues to experience one of the most severe droughts on record. In May, the CA State Water Resources Board adopted regulations mandating water suppliers to cut potable (drinkable) water usage. The Victorville Water District has been mandated to achieve a 28% conservation level compared to 2013 levels. In response to the State mandate, the Victorville Water District adopted Ordinance VWD-012 and Resolution VWD 15-006 as of May 19, 2015.

#### What Does This Mean for Victorville Water District Customers?

- Water waste is prohibited. Water waste is defined as "unreasonable or non-beneficial use of water...use of water for any purpose which allows flooding or run off..."
- It is prohibited to water of turf, ground cover, open ground, shrubs, etc. in a manner or to an extent which allows Excess Runoff. Excess Runoff is defined to be runoff which causes flooding, impedes traffic, creates a hazardous condition, or causes damage to public or private rights of way.
- Use of potable (drinkable) water in fountains or other water features is prohibited, unless the fountain has a re-circulating system.
- Washing down solid surfaces such as driveways, sidewalks, or patios is prohibited, unless necessary for health or safety.
- Restaurants are prohibited from serving water to customers, unless it is specifically requested.
- It is prohibited to apply water to outdoor landscapes during or within 48 hours of measurable rain.
- It is prohibited to irrigate ornamental turf on public street medians.
- Motor vehicle washing is prohibited, except at commercial washes with recirculating system.
- Pools/spas must be covered when not in use.
- Fall overseeding of turf areas, unless irrigated with reclaimed water for non-residential water intensive landscape is prohibited.

Properties without addresses and other large outdoor landscapes such as parks, schools, cemeteries, golf courses, etc. are prohibited from Wed/Sat watering. Those with Large Systems of more than 10 watering stations can submit alternative "Reduction Plan" showing how conservation will be achieved.

Watering by hand those brown or dry spots at other times is allowed, if a hand-held hose is equipped with a shut off nozzle.








## Victorville City Library Receiving More Improvements

The Victorville City Library recently received a new rooftop and improvements to the parking lot area thanks to two Community Development Block Grants (CDBG), making these improvements possible. The most recent renovation to the City Library parking lot consists of adding twelve LED energy efficient light poles standing 20 feet high. The CDBG grant totaled \$54,400 and was awarded in December 2014. Increasing the exterior lighting was done to improve the level of security for the library's many patrons as well as the staff. In February, 2015, the City Library received a second CDBG grant to remove the existing roof and install an entirely new roof. This particular project was awarded to the lowest bidder at an anticipated cost of \$156,097. In February of 2014, the City Library received an upgrade to its internet service and has since been offering patrons free hi-speed internet. In June, 2014, the City Library received another upgrade to offer free WiFi to its patrons.

"Libraries continue to be a relevant aspect in a successful community. We offer, for free, the technology today's society requires in order to accommodate the various needs of our patrons' day-to-day lives such as job searches and applications, educational resources, completing governmental forms, as well as socializing," said Karen Everett, Victorville's City Librarian. In 2006, the Victorville City Library received a CDBG Grant in the amount of \$300,000 for the Library renovation which included a meeting room, a complete restroom renovation and also a realignment of the handicap ramp. This renovation in 2006, also included converting the atrium into a computer technology center. The computer technology center contains 19 public computers that patrons can reserve for up to two hours each day. An additional 12 computers outside of the technology center are also available to the public. All of the computers are equipped with standard office applications, and all have been upgraded with free high-speed Internet access. The Victorville City Library is located at 15011 Circle Drive, Victorville, CA 92395. The hours of operation are Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am until 8:00 pm. Friday hours are 9:00 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. For more information on all services offered by the Victorville City Library, call (760) 245-4222.





## Animal Care & Control

### What you need to know about licensing your dog...

Every dog that lives in the City limits must be licensed and vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the City of Victorville Municipal Code. This helps protect the general health, safety and welfare of all persons within the City.

New residents have 60 days to acquire a license for their dog(s), and persons renewing a dog license have a 30-day grace period following the expiration/renewal date.

In addition, no more than three adult dogs or adult cats can be maintained at a single residence.



**Licensing is easy!** You can download an application from the City's website, then bring it in with proof of rabies vaccination and certificate of sterility, if applicable, to the Victorville City Hall, Cashier's Window, 14343 Civic Drive, M-Th 7:30 - 5:30 or the ACC Division Office, 14206 Amargosa Rd., M-Th 7:00 - 4:30. You may also mail your application to Victorville Animal Care and Control, PO Box 5001, Victorville, CA 92393.


