



City of Victorville CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDE What goes in the Blue Recycling Barrel?

Place all cans, glass bottles/jars, plastic containers, papers and cardboard into your BLUE recycling bin. Make sure to empty and rinse cans and bottles before recycling. Put your blue bin out at the curb by 6 a.m. on your recycling day. Put the bin at least two feet away from mailboxes, cars, or other obstructions.



CARDBOARD & PAPERS

Clean dry papers • Cereal boxes •
Advertisements • Newspapers • Junk Mail



PLASTIC BOTTLES | JARS | TUBS | TRAYS

Yogurt cups • Shampoo bottles • Milk Jugs •
Soda/Water Bottles



TIN & ALUMINUM CANS | FOIL

Empty food, beverage cans.
Also EMPTY aerosol cans.



GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

Bottles & Jars only • Empty and rinse
No dishes, cups, windows, pyrex, etc.

No plastic bags in recycle barrel, please! The plastic bags jam up our sorting machines.



WHAT ABOUT CRV BOTTLES AND CANS? You've got options!


1. Keep your CRV bottles and cans separate and redeem them for cash at a local recycling buy-back center. Go to www.BottlesAndCans.com to find a buy-back center near you.
2. If you don't want to redeem the CRV, just put them in your blue curbside recycling barrel with other recyclables.

Got TVs, Tires, Mattresses, Appliances, E-Waste, Scrap Metal, and Cardboard Boxes?

City of Victorville residents can dispose of all these items FOR FREE at the City of Victorville Recycling Drop-off Center, located at 15164 Anacapa (one block south of Palmdale, between Amargosa and Borego.) Open Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturdays 8 a.m. to Noon. Up to five passenger vehicle or light truck tires, on or off-rim. Victorville residents only - for tires and mattresses. No business. Remember to
license your dog!



Every dog that lives within Victorville City limits must be vaccinated against rabies and licensed in accordance with the City of Victorville Municipal Code. This helps protect the health, safety and welfare of all City residents.

New residents and those acquiring a new dog have 60 days to obtain a license for their dog(s). No more than three dogs or cats can be maintained at a single residence.

Licensing is easy!

You don't even have to bring your dog in. Just bring proof of rabies vaccination and certificate of spay/neuter if applicable, to the City of Victorville City Hall, Cashier's Window, 14343 Civic Drive, M-Th 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., or to the Animal Care & Control office at 14206 Amargosa Rd, M-Th 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. You may also obtain a license through the mail, by first downloading application at www.VictorvilleCA.gov (Quicklink: Animal Care & Control).

HOT DOG!

Leaving your pet in the car isn't cool!

With summer on the way, Victorville Animal Control would like to remind residents: Please do not leave pets unattended in vehicles in warm weather. Temperatures in a vehicle rise very quickly, and cracked windows offer little to no relief for your animal. To avoid possible injury or death to your pet—as well as a citation or possible seizure of your animal, please leave your animals at home where they can be safe and comfortable.

75	100	10 minutes
75	120	30 minutes
85	90	5 minutes
85	100	7-10 minutes
85	120	30 minutes
100	140	15 minutes

City of Victorville Animal Care & Control would like to remind residents to properly handle the remains of deceased animals. Animal Care & Control provides a \$25 home pickup service for Victorville residents to respectfully handle the remains for you. Residents who own their own homes can choose to bury the animal on their own property. It is not permissible to dispose of your pet in the rolling cart for weekly trash service. Please remember, illegal dumping does include abandonment of animal remains.
