



Got Stuff You Don't Want?

Where To Donate and/or Resell
Your Used Household Goods



As the years go by, we all accumulate items that we really don't want any more even though they can still be used. Discarding these unwanted, but still usable, household items not only wastes valuable natural resources, it also costs you and the City money in landfill disposal fees. Throwing these items away also wastes the opportunity to put the items to good use by donating them to needy individuals or groups in your community.

Instead of throwing your used items away, try some of these alternatives:

DONATE:

Attached is a listing of many non-profit groups and businesses that accept donations of household goods. Different groups accept items ranging from eyeglasses to clothing to furniture and appliances. **Note:** Please **be considerate** by making sure your donations are **usable**. These groups cannot use soiled or damaged items any more than you can.

HOLD A GARAGE SALE:

A garage sale is an easy way to earn a few extra dollars while getting rid of your surplus household goods. Remember to obtain a garage sale permit (\$5.00) from the City Planning Department at City Hall, 14343 Civic Drive, M-TH, 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. The permit allows you to sell your goods for up to three consecutive days from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and only allowed 4 times a year. CLASSIFIED ADVERTISEMENTS:

If you only have a few, higher value items to get rid of, try running a classified ad in a local newspaper or "recycler" weekly paper. If you want to give those items away, ask if the paper offers those ads for free.

SWAP MEET:

The Maclin Markets Open Air Swap Meet at the Victorville Fairgrounds is a great place to sell surplus items. It is open every Saturday and Sunday, and thousands of people attend. Call 1-800-222-SHOP for more information.

ONLINE RESOURCES:

Not only can you get rid of your spare items in-person, but you can also do it over the internet. There are many websites that allow a person to post an item on the site to give away or sell. Craig's List is one very popular website used to sell or give away items. Another popular online resource is Freecycle. This site allows you to give away any items that you would otherwise end up in the landfill. Facebook has a new group called Buy Nothing (Apple Valley, Hesperia, Victorville), join the group near you. For more information on these sites, visit them at www.craigslist.org, www.freecycle.org, and www.facebook.com. You may also want to try selling higher value items on EBAY.
