



## **Victorville Residents- Bring Us Your Waste Tires For FREE!**



***Businesses will not be allowed to dispose of any tires at this event.***

On **Saturday, June 13, 2009 from 8a.m. to 12 noon**, the City of Victorville will have a Waste Tire Amnesty Day funded through a grant issued by the California Integrated Waste Management Board.

City of Victorville residents may bring up to 9 used or waste passenger vehicle tires to the Victor Valley Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) and dispose of them for **FREE**. The MRF is located at 17000 Abbey Lane, just off of Stoddard Wells Road, in the north part of Victorville.

There are only two requirements:

1. Bring your California issued identification with your current Victorville address. (A current paystub, or bill, may be used as proof of residence.)
2. Bring no more than nine tires. (It is a violation of the California Vehicle Code to transport ten or more tires at a time!)

### **GOT MORE THAN 9 TIRES?**

Exceptions will be made for persons wanting to bring fewer than twenty tires, with prior approval. Call the Victorville Code Enforcement Division at 760-955-5104 at least seven days prior to this event to obtain written authorization.

### **GOT APPLIANCES, OLD TVS, COMPUTERS, or SCRAP METAL TOO?**

# What Goes in the Blue Recycling Bin?

1

**PAPER & CARDBOARD:** Includes newspapers, advertisements, magazines, junk mail, phone books, notebook paper, catalogs, cereal boxes (w/out liners), paper egg cartons, paper grocery bags, all types of cardboard boxes, and all other clean, dry papers.

**TIN & ALUMINUM CANS:** Includes food and drink cans, pet food cans, EMPTY aerosol cans, also clean aluminum foil and foil trays.



**GLASS BOTTLES & JARS:** Includes bottles and jars only. No dishes, no light bulbs, no windows.

**PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS, TUBS, & TRAYS # 1- # 7:** Includes milk and water jugs, detergent and shampoo bottles, food jars, yogurt cups, microwave trays, etc.

**How To Recycle? It's Easy With the Blue Recycling Bin...** Just put all your paper, cardboard, cans, bottles, and plastic containers mixed together in your BLUE recycling bin. All cans and bottles must be totally empty. Rinse all food containers. No soiled or wet papers. Napkins, paper plates, tissues, and diapers all go in the green trash can. No plastic bags. No food. No yard waste.

**Recycling—It's the Law!** California State Law AB 939 requires all communities to divert 50% of waste from the landfill. Every household needs to meet the 50% recycling requirement to reach the city-wide goal.

**Recycling—It's Good for the Environment!** Recycling saves resources, reduces energy used to make new products, reduces air and water emissions from making new products, and helps reduce greenhouse gases.

Only five tires per visit and tires must be off rim. No businesses. The HHWCC is located on Love's Lane, off of Desert Knolls Drive, behind the Fairgrounds. Open Wednesdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Call 955-5229 for details.
