





Key Findings



PARK USERS

Hook Park, Sunset Ridge Park and the Hook Community Center are the most used parks and recreation facilities in Victorville.



LEVEL OF SATISFACTION

Respondents are generally satisfied with the overall quality of events, programs, parks and facilities provided by Victorville. However, safety and cleanliness at parks is a large concern.



IMPORTANCE

Trails and pathways and community /neighborhood parks are the most important facilities and youth sports programs and special events are the most important programs to resident households.



FUTURE FACILITY NEEDS

Improved amenities, additional trails and trail connectivity, splash pad water features/aquatic facilities, and playgrounds are the most important facility needs for the community in the next 5-10 years.

Key Findings



TRAILS & PATHWAYS

Trails and pathways are the most important amenity to households in Victorville; however, households do not feel trails and pathways offered in Victorville are meeting the needs of the community.



VALUES & VISION

Providing a high level of safety and security at facilities is considered the most important purpose of parks and recreation in Victorville. Ensuring parks and recreation opportunities are accessible to all residents follow.



COMMUNICATION

Rec Pages activity guide/brochure is the most preferred method to receive information. Email from the City and the City website are also popular ways to reach residents of Victorville. Results demonstrate a need to maintain variety in communication methods in Victorville.



INCREASE USE

Better safety and security, more lighting, and better maintenance of parks and facilities would increase use at Victorville parks and recreation facilities.





Demographic Profile

About 40% of respondents identify as Hispanic/Latino/Spanish origin. Race, aligns closely to U.S. Census Data for Victorville. Approximately 64% of survey respondents identify as White and 14% Black or African American. The U.S. Census data for Victorville indicates that 68% identify as White and 20% identify as black.




Satisfaction




Overall Satisfaction

Overall satisfaction with the quality of Victorville parks and recreation is above average. Events attended in the past 12 months rated the highest, with 59% either satisfied or very satisfied. Recreation facilities (e.g., community centers, aquatics) has the largest share of respondents who gave a poor rating, with 18% being somewhat dissatisfied or not at all satisfied with the overall quality.



Agree/ Disagree Park Statements

Respondents were asked how much they agree or disagree with a few statements concerning parks. Overall, 68% of respondents agree or completely agree that the homeless population at parks is a concern. More than half (53%) of respondents feel that park cleanliness needs to be improved. Less than half (43%) agree that Victorville parks and facilities are well maintained. Furthermore, 3 out of 10 respondents do not feel safe at Victorville parks.




Current Usage



On a 5-point scale of familiarity with parks and recreation offerings, approximately 59% of respondents rated their familiarity as somewhat familiar or very familiar. However, 15% of respondents are somewhat not familiar or not at all familiar. Overall, awareness of parks and recreation offerings is moderately high; however, there is still some room to improve awareness.




Parks & Recreation Familiarity

Hook Park is the most used park/recreation facility in Victorville, with nearly half of respondents indicating they use this park. About 40% of respondents also indicated that they use the Hook Community Center.


Which Victorville parks / recreation facilities have been used by your household in the past 12 months?

Parks & Recreation Usage Top 3

When asked to select three parks/recreation facilities that are used most frequently, Hook Park stood out among the other parks and recreation facilities (41% top three). Sunset Ridge Park and Hook Community Center are the second and third most frequented by respondents (each 26%).





Needs Met of Current Programs & Special Events


How well do you think the recreation programs and special events currently meet the needs of the community?



Importance of Current Facilities & Parks

When asked what recreation facilities and parks were most important to their household, overall respondents highlighted trails and pathways and community/neighborhood parks as the most important offerings. Majority of respondents feel that all listed facilities and parks are at least somewhat important to their household.




When asked how well recreation facilities and parks are meeting the needs of the community, respondents mostly agree that the recreation facilities and parks offered in Victorville are meeting the needs. However, 29% of respondents do not agree that the aquatic facility is meeting the needs of the community and 26% do not agree that indoor athletic courts are meeting the needs.

Low needs met**


These “niche” facilities/programs have a small but passionate following, so measuring participation when planning for future improvements may prove to be valuable.

Current levels of support appear to be adequate. Future discussions evaluating whether the resources supporting these facilities/programs outweigh the benefits may be constructive.





What are the most important items that, if addressed by the City of Victorville, would increase your use of parks and recreation facilities?



















More respondents rated communication effectiveness as somewhat effective or very effective (46%) than those who rated communication somewhat not effective or not at all effective (25%). There is some room for improvement to better leverage communication efforts and information dissemination about parks and recreation facilities and services to further create awareness.



More private/public partnerships saw the strongest support (55%) for potential funding sources from respondents and approximately 43% of respondents support a bond referendum for specific projects. Lower support was given to a new dedicated sales tax or an increased property tax.



Community Comments



Community Comments “safe”

The word “safe” was mentioned in 52 comments and was the 4th most mentioned word. Analyzing the open-ended comments that contained the word “safe” indicate that safety is a major concern at parks and the communities desire for safe parks in Victorville. Below are a random selection of verbatim responses that include the word “safe”.

I have really pulled away from the community in the last several years. I don't feel safe and there are not enough programs for what a huge community needs.

I would love the overall appearance of parks to change and security. Do not feel safe.

I've lived in Victorville for now 6 years and though I love the city and the people here, I wish the city would put a bigger effort on creating a safer spaces for the community within the already existing parks. I have to take my kids to parks further away from home because the ones close to me do not feel safe. Also, I really hope they build more parks and outdoor spaces for the newer communities. Victorville is growing!

Just moved here from Virginia and can't find a decent dog park. Went to Doris Davies park around noon one day and there were homeless people sleeping or just laying around. Did not feel safe at all.

Making the parks safe will bring more people outside without fear. The city is beautiful and needs to be seen. Let's show the kids what it means to play outside instead of on the TV.

We need our community to be a safe place for everyone. Safe and clean. It's very disappointing to see the amount of homeless and the trash we have.



 - Deferred maintenance backlog
 - Most parks have off-street parking and restrooms
 - Need to standardize picnic tables and benches, shelters and parks
 - Lack of shade at playgrounds
 - Lacking skate parks and dog parks
 - A need exists for a power-washing and painting crew and a roofing crew
- Indoor
 - Generally very limited
 - Need major renovations
 - Lack fitness and exercise equipment






Victorville tends to develop higher scoring parks with more components but few parks and components per capita








