



Mojave Riverwalk Now Open



If you're looking for a great place to take a walk or go for a bicycle ride, we invite you to experience our new Mojave Riverwalk, which officially opened in November. Along this concrete trail, you can enjoy views of our local mountains, nearby desert landscape, Pelican Lake, and a variety of birds and other wildlife.

The trail starts at the Fish Hatchery Road at the Victor Valley Campus, continues under the Yucca Loma Bridge and continues into Mojave Narrows Regional Park, a distance of 3.8 miles one way. The covered shade structures located at the trail head near Fish Hatchery Road are a great place to sit in the shade and enjoy a packed-lunch.

We used federal grant monies, local transportation funds and Measure I dollars to fund this project. We hope you will come out and enjoy this great amenity for our community.

Progress Continues on Green Tree Extension

We're making good progress on our Green Tree Extension Project, which will extend Green Tree Boulevard from Hesperia Road to Ridgecrest/Yates Road providing an additional travel corridor between Victorville and Apple Valley.

The project passed another significant milestone on Oct. 1 when the Victorville City Council approved an agreement with BNSF, which provides necessary easements for the new roadway to pass over the BNSF Railway.

At this time, the design is complete, the funding agreement with San Bernardino County Transportation Authority has been approved, and right of way acquisition is almost complete. We continue to make progress on this important capital improvement project. Watch for updates to be released in the coming months.

What's New With Environmental Programs?

Recent State Laws Focus on Organics Waste Reduction

CA State Law Assembly Bill (AB) 1826 was enacted in 2014 with the goal of reducing the amount of organic waste disposed in landfills, thereby reducing methane gas emissions. Organic wastes, including food waste, garden trimmings, and wood wastes, comprise over 30% of the waste sent to landfills state-wide. AB 1826 requires local jurisdictions to implement programs to divert organics, and also requires certain businesses and multi-family dwellings with 5+ units to recycle/divert organics. As of January 2019, all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards/week of trash/recycling are required to divert organics from the trash. The City of Victorville, through the services of Victorville Disposal, is now offering food waste and wood waste collection programs for Victorville businesses. A commercial garden trimming program is under development. As of October 2019, approximately 90 Victorville businesses are separating food scraps for composting, and more are being added to the program each month.

CA State Law Senate Bill (SB) 1383 was enacted in 2016 and established the goal of reducing methane gas emissions by 40% by the year 2030 vs. 2013 levels. To achieve this goal, the law requires a 50% reduction in the amount of organics disposed in landfill by 2020 vs. 2014 levels and a 75% reduction in organics disposal by 2025. It also requires that 20% of surplus, edible food be recovered for human consumption by 2025. The State is now in the process of finalizing regulations which will go into effect January 1, 2022. SB 1383 regulations will mandate new programs for the diversion of organic materials—including residential organic materials such as garden trimmings.

Your Recycling & Trash Questions Answered!

Q. What should I do with used needles/syringes?

A. Many residents use syringes to administer insulin or other medications. After use, syringes or "sharps" MUST be placed in an approved sharps container, and then must be taken to the City's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center for proper disposal. Do not place sharps in the trash or recycling bins. It is ILLEGAL to dispose of sharps in trash or recycling, and more importantly, it is a terrible safety hazard to trash/recycling collectors and workers at the recycling processing facility.

Q. Where can I get an approved sharps container?

A. It's easy! You can get a FREE sharps container at the City of Victorville HHW Center on Loves Lane, off of Desert Knoll Drive, behind the County Fairgrounds. The HHW Center is open Wednesdays and Sundays from 9:00am-4:00pm. You may also want to ask your pharmacist about a sharps container, when you fill your prescription for syringes.


