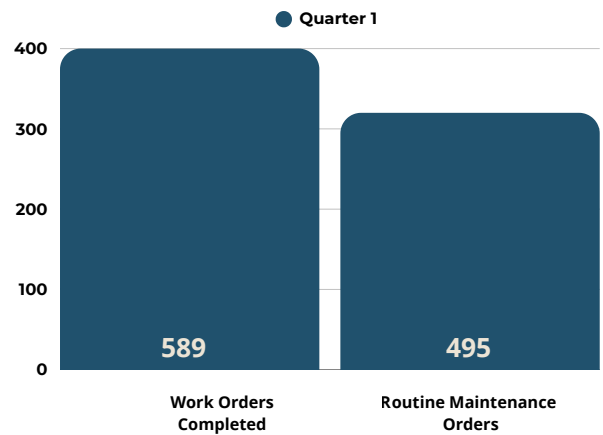
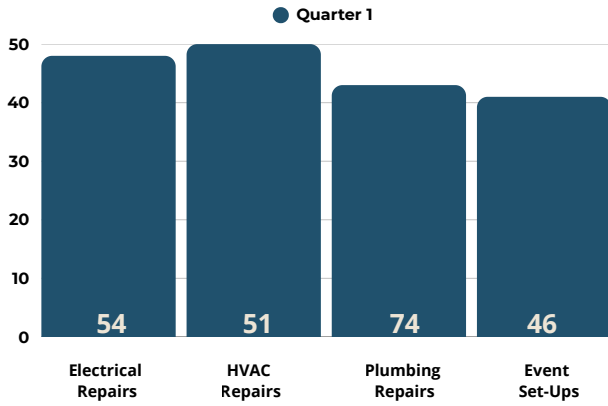


The Community Services Department is committed to enhancing residents' lives through programs, parks, and facilities that meet the community's educational, recreational, and cultural needs.

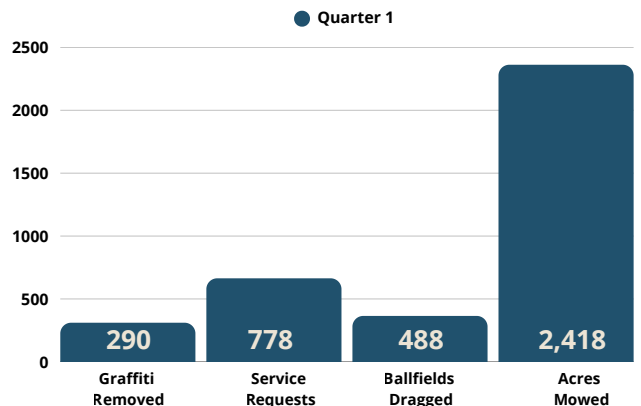
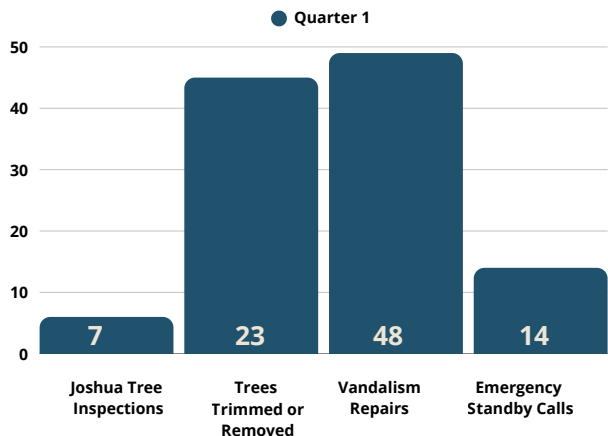
- **Library** provides access to educational resources, technology, and lifelong learning opportunities.
