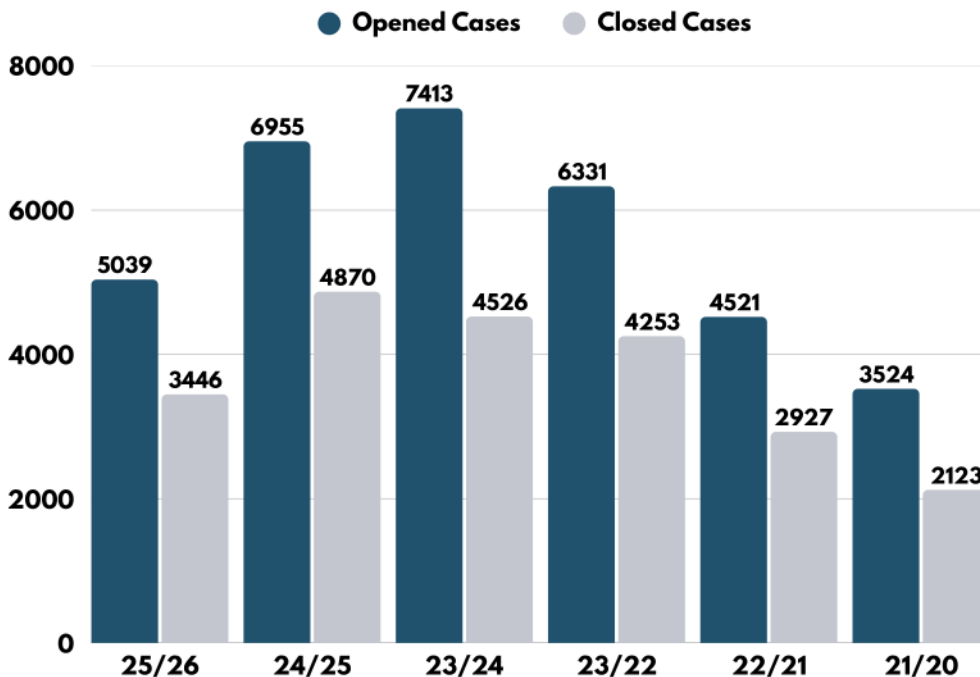

TOTAL CODE CASES PER FISCAL YEAR

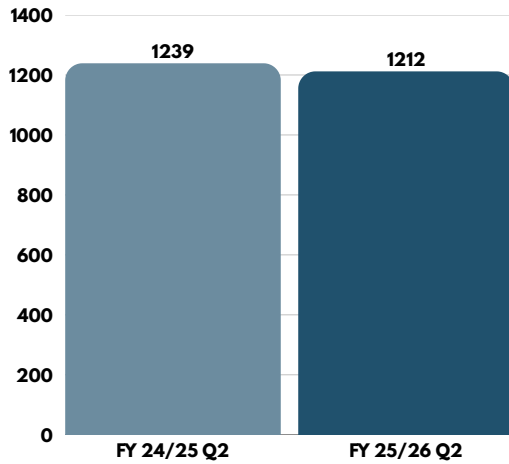

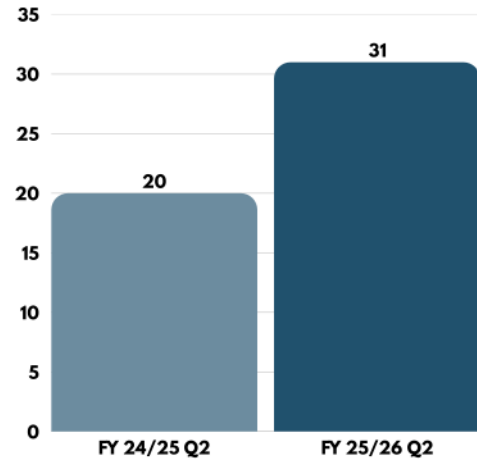

QUARTER 2 ENFORCEMENT INSPECTIONS BY CASE CATEGORY

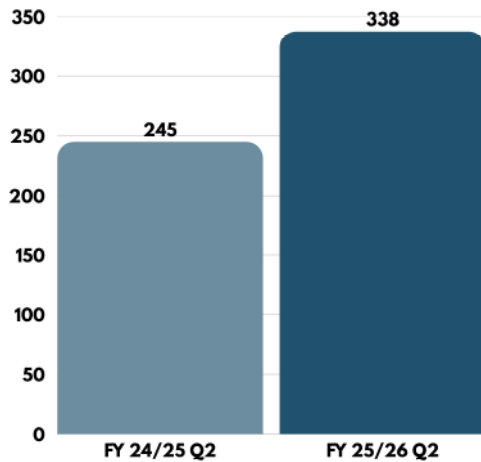

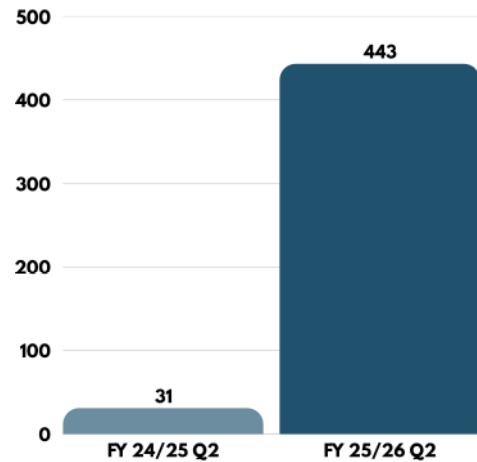

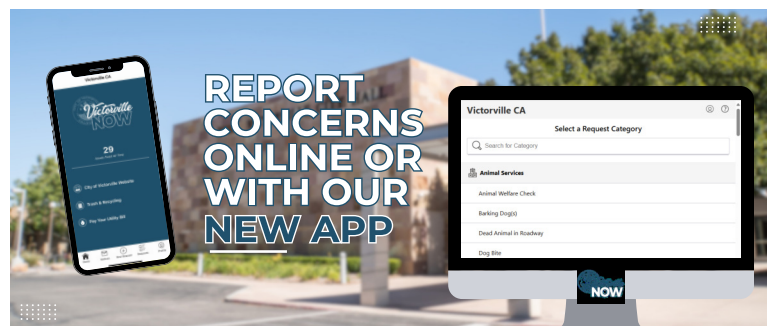




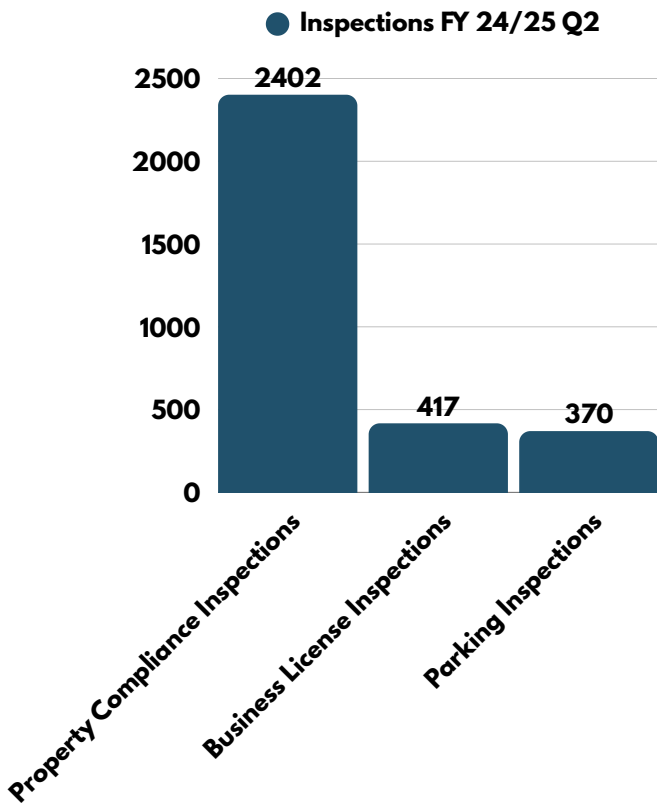
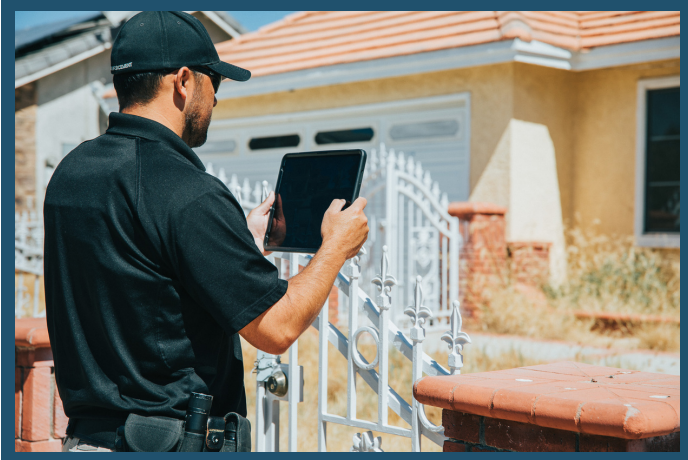
VictorvilleNow CASE REQUESTS Q2 612 CASES



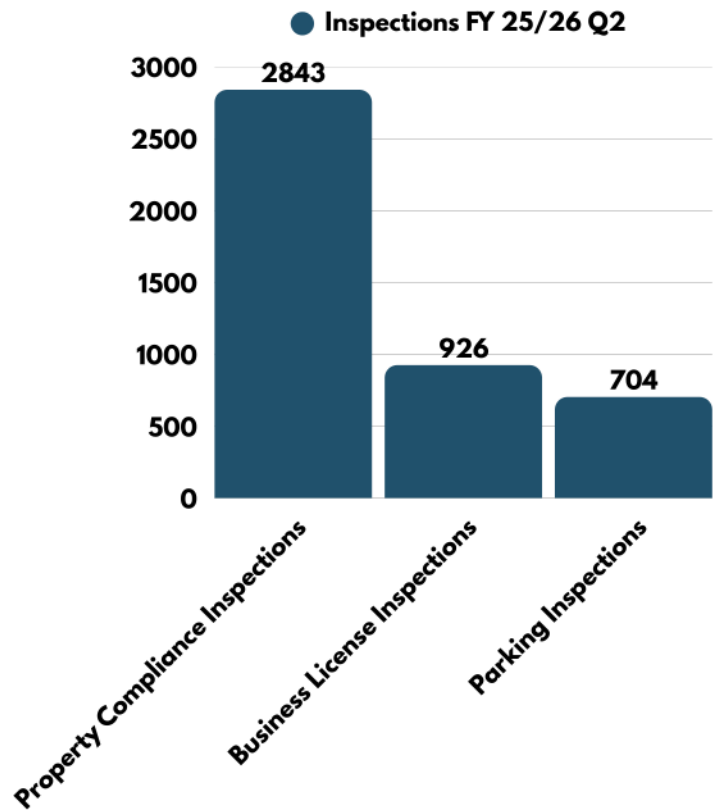
A total of **612** VictorvilleNow requests were submitted between October and December 2025.

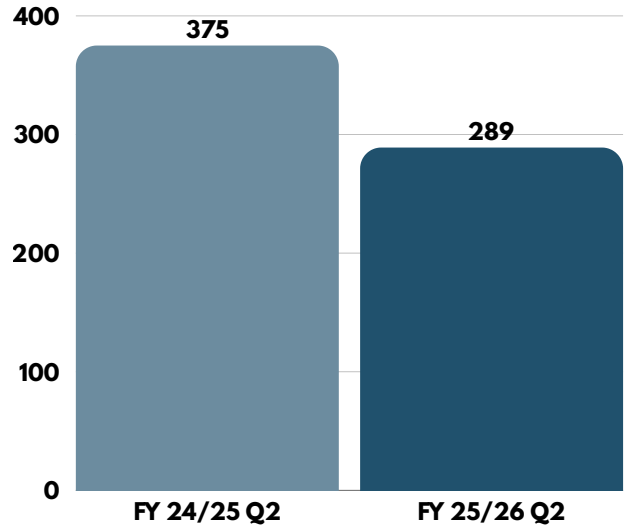

TOTAL PARKING CITATIONS ISSUED

During the second quarter of FY 25/26, the City issued **289** citations related to parking violations. 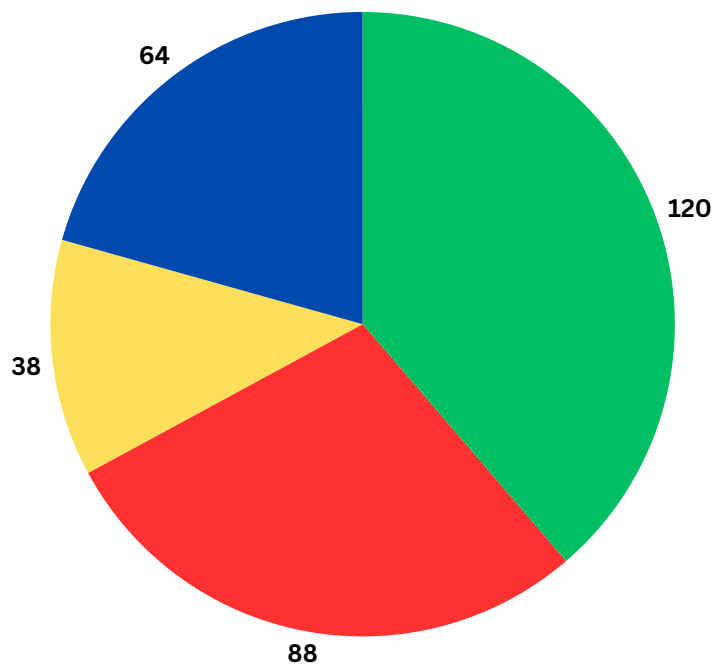

PROGRAM IMPACT

The CEP and CCEP programs continue to play a key role in improving neighborhood and commercial corridor conditions by addressing blight, code violations, and safety concerns. This quarter's focus was on commercial compliance, reflected in the high volume of inspections and active cases. These efforts demonstrate strong enforcement activity and continued progress toward cleaner, safer, and more attractive communities.



HOMELESS ENGAGEMENT

HOMELESS ENGAGEMENT Q2 FY 25/26

The City of Victorville's Homeless Engagement Team (HET) continues to address homeless encampments on public and private property through a coordinated approach that balances outreach, resource connection, and enforcement. During the second quarter, HET focused on large-scale encampment cleanups, increased enforcement operations, and expanded access to emergency shelter resources through the City's Wellness Center and the Motel Voucher Program.

ENCAMPMENT CLEANUPS & FIELD OPERATIONS

Riverbed / 6th Street / Mineral Road

October 10–11, 2025

- Total Tonnage Removed: 29.02 tons
- 6 RVs towed
- 2 individuals sheltered

Enterprise Way / Hesperia Road / Coad Road

November 22, 2025

- Total Tonnage Removed: 9 tons

These operations were conducted in coordination with Public Works, Sanitation, Victorville Police Department, and Animal Services to ensure safe and effective cleanup of hazardous encampment areas.



HOMELESS ENGAGEMENT CONTINUED

JOINT ENFORCEMENT & OUTREACH OPERATIONS

- 6 enforcement operations completed
- Included 2 nighttime enforcement operations

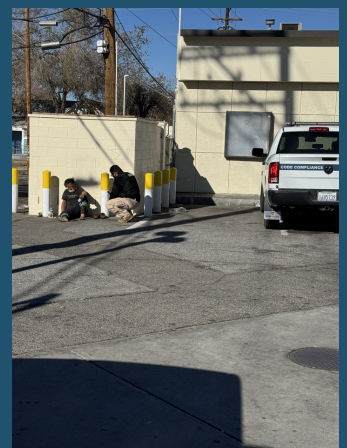
PD / HET “Walking Wednesday” Outreach & Education (Old Town)

- Newly initiated enforcement and outreach presence
- Focused on educating property owners and business owners
- 6 operations completed
- Goal increased to 2 per week

HET Joint Night Outreach Operation

- First-ever nighttime outreach operation completed
- 12 individuals sheltered through the MVP Voucher Program

These collaborative efforts strengthen public safety while ensuring individuals experiencing homelessness are offered immediate access to services and shelter.
