


MAKE A YouTube VIDEO



Due November 15th

Who May Enter?

All student groups comprised of K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible. Videos must be filmed and created by a student group.

Identification & Permission Slip

All student groups must turn in an approved entry form for their video and permission forms for each student under age 18 that appears in their video. Entry forms and permission forms should be turned in with your school's Final Report Form on November 15, 2018.

Design Theme

Videos can cover any aspect of "Recycling in the City of Victorville." Possible ideas include (1) why recycling is important, (2) how recycling helps the environment, (3) "call to action" message encouraging participation in the City of Victorville's recycling programs, and/or (4) explanation of what items can go into recycling containers.

Video Specifications

- Videos must be at least 1 minute long but no more than 4 minutes long.
- All videos must be original. Videos taken by anyone other than the student group whose name appears on the video contest entry form will be disqualified.
- Copyrighted characters, such as Superman, or logos, such as sports team's logos, should not be included in the videos. The use of lettering, numbering, or a school logo in any language in the video is not allowed with the exception of the City of Victorville logo.
- Music, humor, and acting are all encouraged to make the message more fun and appealing.



Deadline & Judging

Videos must be uploaded to YouTube by November 15, 2018. Videos with at least 100 YouTube views as of 7:30 a.m. on November 30, 2018 will qualify as a finalist video. Finalist videos will be evaluated to determine if each meets the minimum requirements and a judging committee will select the Grand Prize video.

Grand Prize Winner

The Grand Prize student group video will win a cash prize for their school. Winning video and other honorable mentions may be posted on the City website: www.Victorville Recycles.com.

MAKE A POSTER

Due November 15th

Who May Enter?

All K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible. **No group posters will be accepted. A poster may only be submitted by a single artist.**

Posters will be grouped in one of the following categories:

- Kindergarten— 3rd Grade
- 4th- 6th Grade
- 7th- 12th Grade

Identification

The following information should appear on the back of the poster:
Artist's name, age, grade, school, and classroom teacher.

Design Theme

Posters should express the importance of "Recycling in the City of Victorville."

Poster Specifications


- Poster Paper will be provided to participating schools by the City of Victorville. Email Josie Vargas at jvargas@burrtec.com if you need additional poster paper.
- All artwork must be original. Copyrighted characters, such as Superman, or copyrighted clip art, or copyright-free clip art will not be accepted.
- Any media may be used with the exception of glitter. Chalk, charcoal, and pastel must be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing and smudging. Keep in mind most posters may be on public display and should be easy to see or read.
- Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled, or attached to the artwork in any way. Framed, matted, or laminated artwork will not be accepted. The use of lettering, numbering, or a school logo in any language on the front of the poster is not allowed with the exception of the City of Victorville logo.
- Stenciled, traced, computer-generated, or commercially manufactured stick-on lettering or graphics is prohibited.
- Posters will be judged on both the clarity of the message and the quality of the art.

MAKE A POSTER

Judging Criteria



1. Clear message conveyed by the text and artwork.
2. The “recycle” poster theme is addressed.
3. Creativity, originality and artistic quality.
4. Visual Clarity– easily read.
5. Bright and colorful.

The three best posters in each grade category will be judged based on the criteria listed above. First, Second, and Third places will be awarded in each grade category. The first place winning posters from each grade category will compete with other first place winning posters from other participating schools for a chance to win the grand prize.

Delivery

Folded posters will not be accepted. Artwork should be packed and wrapped flat. Please read the poster contest rules carefully, as only posters that meet the contest rules will be considered. MAKE A SCULPTURE

Due November 15th

Who May Enter?

All K-12 students in public, private, and home schools within Victorville city limits are eligible.

Your sculpture should be grouped in one of the following two categories for judging: Individuals or teams may create sculptures. No student may have an entry in both divisions.

- Kindergarten– 6th Grade
- 7th– 12th Grade

Design Theme

Sculptures can be any theme at all: they just need to showcase the creative use of recycled materials. Sculptures can be abstract or represent actual objects or scenes.

Sculptures

Sculptures may be abstract or realistic, but non-offensive.

All parts of the sculpture must be securely attached

Glue, tape, string, wire, and thread are permitted. Hot glued is recommended.

Sculptures may not exceed

2 feet wide by 2 feet long by 2 feet tall and be self-supporting – able to stand on their own when displayed. If the sculpture must hang, the hanging mechanism must be supplied – nothing can hang on the walls. Please do not use wood for the base – makes structure very heavy to transport.

All materials used must be “clean”...

free of food remains or dirt.

Please use as many recyclable materials as possible.

The majority of items used for your sculpture must be common household recyclables such as aluminum cans, junk mail, tin cans, steel cans, plastics #1-#7, newspaper, cardboard, and cereal boxes. Absolutely no alcoholic beverage or tobacco product containers or packaging. (See attached handout on recyclables.)

DO NOT PAINT the sculpture

Judges will want to see the actual recyclables and other materials used in the sculpture. Painted recyclables cannot be properly recycled after the competition.

MAKE A SCULPTURE

November 15th

All sculptures must have a title

Be creative. Use adjectives to describe your title. "The Little Worm" could be "The Squirmy, Wiggly, Wonderful Worm."

Identification

The following information should be attached to the sculpture on a 3 x5 card: Artist's name(s), school's name, Grade(s), classroom teacher.

Judging

Sculptures should be taken to the City Recycling Program at Victorville City Hall. The City will furnish each participating school with prizes for your participating students. The first place winning sculptures will compete with other school first place winning sculptures for a chance to win the grand prize.

Sculpture Delivery

Each school's sculptures in individual groups or team groups sculptures should be received no later than Thursday, November 15th, 2018, by 5:30 p.m. Please have arrangements for delivery firmly in place. You may have to ask a parent to make the sculpture delivery. Please read the recycled sculpture contest rules carefully, as only sculptures that meet the contest rules will be considered. Winners

Judging Criteria

1. Originality, Creativity— Use of items that most would not think of using.
2. Sculpture Title— Depicts what is seen.
3. Naturally Colorful— Painting of recyclables is not accepted.
4. Aesthetics— How it "looks"; Is it put together nicely?
5. Use of many different kinds of recyclables— A list of recyclables used in the sculpture should be included.

Please Note: If your students/school would like sculptures returned back to them, please notify Josie Vargas prior to dropping off your sculptures. Otherwise, all sculptures submitted become the property of the City of Victorville Recycling Program and will not be returned.




Be a Food Rescuer
